A son of Vienna, Austria, Franz Schubert is one of Classical music's greats, and this Sanctus is a part of his larger Deutsche Messe.

We are using a version of the Lord's Prayer from the **New Zealand** Prayer Book, influenced by the native Maori culture. With the bread we need for today, feed us. In the hurts we absorb from one another, forgive us. In times of temptation and testing, strengthen us. From trials too great to endure, spare us. From the grip of all that is evil, free us.

During the distribution of communion, all are invited to join in the singing of these three Eucharistic songs from South Korea, France, and Liberia.

Sometimes referred to as a "communion calypso," this upbeat hymn from **Jamaica** sends us back out into the world.

We echo the benedictory words by singing this folk melody from Argentina.

Finally, the organ closes our service with a sortie (French for 'exit') by a composer popular in Australia.
