PASTOR'S CORNER

A Ministry of Space

One of the greatest desires of our congregation, in recent years, has been to find ways to offer the use of our facilities for the benefit of the community. Like many churches, we provide space for important support groups like Alcoholics Anonymous and the National Alliance of Mental Illness. Recently, we have started opening our doors for other kinds of programs as well.

Earlier this fall, we renewed an agreement with the Boyle County Adult Education/GED Program to provide space for GED instruction and testing for a second year. Students come to the program through referrals from the Danville Housing Authority and other members of the United Human Services network as well as the court system. Our own Beth Leahey and Gail Jackson are instructors for this life-changing program.

Last month, the Session approved a new agreement with Centre College to allow their students to use the Fellowship Hall for an after-school tutoring program. Now when you come into the church on Tuesday and Thursday afternoons, you will see more than 50 youngsters, along with their Centre tutors, doing homework in the Fellowship Hall and burning off their extra energy in the gym and on the playground.

The students are primarily immigrants enrolled in the elementary schools of the Danville and Boyle County school systems and need extra help mastering their English language skills. Coordinated by Don Porter, nine of our members act as hosts, greeting folks at the door and making sure the space is ready for their use and cleaned up afterward.

Starting next week, we will be offering our space for a women's book study co-led by the Rev. Amy Dafler Meaux (Trinity Episcopal Church) and me every other Tuesday morning. Our purpose is to engage with scripture and build community among women of all ages and stages of their faith journeys. We will begin with Rachel Held Evans', *Inspired: Slaying Giants, Walking on Water, and Loving the Bible Again,* a book written by a former evangelical Christian for evangelical <u>and</u> mainline Protestants.

These groups all provide educational and/or spiritual support and strive to build relationships among different groups in our community. We don't fill every room every day, but more and more our ministry of space is growing allowing God to transform lives, even ours.

LET THERE BE LIGHT—AND LET THE ELECTRICITY FLOW

One of the first lessons we learned from the Bible is that God created light, and called it good. We all know how good and important sunlight is. Not only does it warm our faces, grow our food, and allow us to see during the daytime, sunlight can also, if harnessed efficiently enough, provide much of the energy we currently get from other sources.

How fitting it is, then, that The Presbyterian Church of Danville recently installed a series of solar panels on its roof, enabling the church to capture that blessed sunlight and generate electricity. Installed by the good people at Solar Energy Solutions, the 124 panels cover 2,240 square feet, and are expected to produce an average of 44,000 kWh per year. The electricity produced varies by the amount of sunlight the panels are exposed to, but they were placed on the south sides of the roof to maximize their exposure. Based on the assumptions and the recent past usage of electricity, these solar panels should save the Church an average of \$5,000 per year in utility costs, money that can be utilized on other capital projects or otherwise.





Consider, too, that the panels came to the Church as a generous gift from an anonymous member. That member believes in the importance of both environmental and financial stewardship, and the gift allows the Church to demonstrate both to the wider community. The more people see of how alternative energy sources are being utilized, the more they will consider using them in their own homes and businesses.

Close to this project is Tim Shelton, the Church's building superintendent. Tim says, "This is a gift that will keep on giving, and

a much-appreciated investment in our facility and our goal to reduce our carbon footprint to conserve our resources."

Long-time member Preston Miles, a retired professor of chemistry at Centre College and an ardent environmentalist, appreciates the gift both for what it allows the Church to do as well as what it allows the Church not to do: "The 44,000 kWh generated each year by the new solar array will avoid 70,000 pounds of carbon dioxide emissions and burning of 34,000 pounds of coal annually."



Valery McMann, chair of the budget and finance committee and also a financial advisor, commented on the value of this project to the Church: "It is a wonderful thing when a project not only has the potential to lessen our Church's environmental impact but also allows our Church to spend less on utilities! These savings can ultimately be redirected to our mission of serving others."

The Presbyterian Church of Danville is pleased to be harnessing natural energy and to be demonstrating to others how well it works. In a way, this is nothing new: The Church has always received its energy from the Son, and now we will get it from the sun, too. What a blessing!

Helping at the Holidays

When you know someone is struggling during the holidays, here are some simple ways you can make a big difference:

Offer to help in specific ways. Try to anticipate needs and ways you can help. For example, you might ask: "Can I help you prepare Thanksgiving dinner?" or "Can I help put out the Christmas lights?" Remember, however, to follow the person's lead and not just impose your help.

Help people pace themselves. The holidays are busy, and those who are hurting may need help or permission to slow down or do less than they ordinarily would. Let people know it's okay to conserve energy, take breaks, and pick which activities and traditions to take part in.

Ask people how they're *really* **doing.** During the busyness of the holidays, it can be easy to just interact with people on a surface level. Finding a good time to ask hurting people how they're really doing and then listening is a powerful way to care.

Validate feelings. When people do open up and share with you, listen and then show that you believe them and accept their feelings. Letting people know it's okay to feel whatever they're feeling can provide a lot of comfort.

By relating in these ways, you can help hurting people find comfort and hope in a difficult time.

Stephen Ministry will sponsor The Longest Night: A Service of Healing and Wholeness at 4:30 pm on Sunday, December 22. This service is open to all and will be followed by a light supper and fellowship.

PEACEFUL THURSDAYS FOR CENTRE STUDENTS

All Centre students are invited to join Caroline each Thursday for "Peaceful Thursdays", a time of meditation and reflection on a particular Bible passage, using the ancient spiritual practice of lectio divina.
